My goals for future learning focus on continuing to keep in touch with strategies and resources as well as collaborating with my colleagues.

Goal #1-Professional Development

While in college, I attended several local and national conferences and found that I learned so much from other educators in that setting. I always leave professional conferences with a feeling of inspiration and several ideas that I want to implement immediately in my classroom because I know it would improve the learning experience for my students. It is this inspiration that I wish to continue infusing into my practice and remain dedicated to being the best educator I can possibly be for my students. My goal in the future will be to attend at least 2 professional conferences each year to stay up to date on new programs and practices and gain inspiration from others.
